It has been a busy year coming off COVID/pandemic. You have come back to church for the most part. I know that some of you still have some health concerns that are holding you back from attending. We pray that you will find the confidence to return soon and worship with us in person. We are still striving for masks only in the Friendship Room so there is a safe place to worship.

Our theme this year is "SERVE." We have been studying the Book of Mark to see how Jesus ministered to or served people throughout the book. Our key verse for the year has been Mark 10:45..." For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many." That "serve" thing is a difficult thing for us even as Christians. We are busy, we don't want to get involved in people's messy lives, we are tired and it is someone else's turn to serve... I could go on. You have all heard the excuses over the years. Jesus however had a sense of urgency about serving others as a means of showing them love and compassion. He had a short window of opportunity. Our window of opportunity is getting short as well. Our culture is changing rapidly and that is not going to change. The thing that must change is us. It will take all 400-500 of us to make a difference in the world we live in today. It takes more and more "contacts" or "encounters" with someone to help them see they need a savior.

As a church, we need to be looking for opportunities to do ministry. And when we find them, we need people to serve in those opportunities. We need people to serve in our tech ministry. I love Jim and Nancy, Tim, Tyler and Stephen, but I get tired of seeing only them back there in the tech area on Sunday. There is a need, see it and respond. In a church the size of ours, should there ever be a need to pay people to serve in the nursery? We were asked about having coffee available again on Sunday mornings but not many asked if they could make it. We have an ongoing opportunity to help those in poverty climb out. Core Communities of Augusta has overwhelmingly voted to remain with us rather than return to their previous site. However, it takes people to serve as host on Thursday evenings. So far it has fallen on two or three people. How about more greeters? We will need people to step up and help with AWANA's this fall as Miss Melissa will finish her time with us as CM Director at the end of July. We will need to address that situation at the business meeting that was announced last Sunday for later in July. Please do me a favor and begin to check the missions board by the sanctuary doors. There are going to be plenty of opportunities for people to serve.

I heard a quote from Chuck Swindoll this weekend at the church Sherry and I attended while away. "When hearts are right, feet are swift." When your heart is right, your feet are swift to respond to ministry opportunities and needs. Are your feet swift? Or do your feet drag thinking someone else can do it or will do it? My Bible says that everyone was gifted in some way and that not everyone has the same gifts. I wonder why that is? Does it mean that it takes many, many people with diverse gifts to become a whole, healthy body of servants?

I know this sounds like a grumpy old man...get off my grass! Part of the failure to have ample servants lies on me. I need to make a bigger point of letting you know where the opportunities are. As I try to do a better job of letting you know, will you be more intentional in seeking opportunities? If there is an activity at church...any kind of activity...there is a need for servants. Let us become a people who don't wait to be asked, let's seek out ministry opportunities. What did JFK say...ask not what your church can do for you but what can you do for your church? Well, not exactly but you get the drift!


The Deacons Minute




